

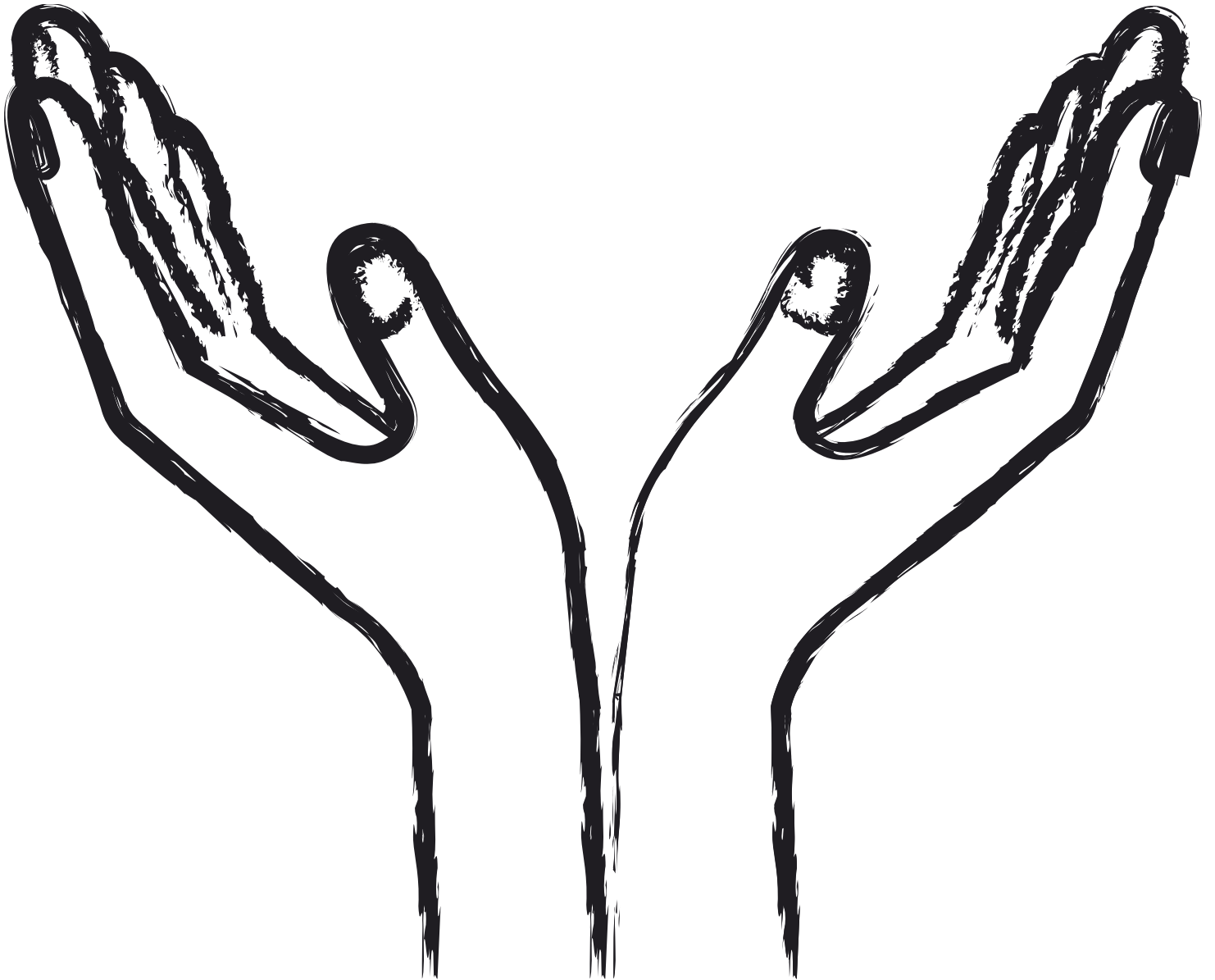
EXODUS

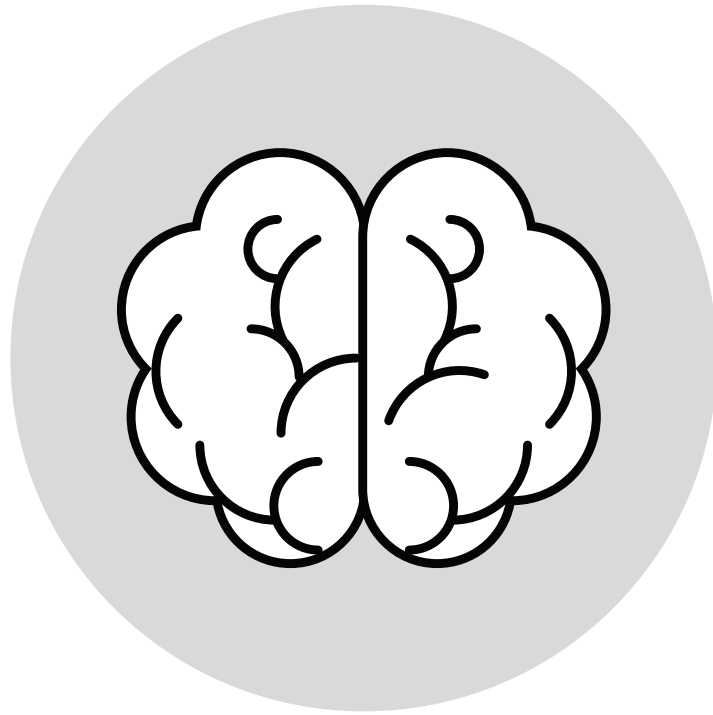
Exodus 2:5-10 NIRV
